Each year KYOTOPHONIE brings together an eclectic mix of local and international artists to perform in Kyoto. Held annually in the Spring and Autumn, the festival was established in 2023 by Lucille Reyboz and Yusuke Nakanishi, co-founders of the KYOTOGRAPHIE International Photography Festival. Both festivals connect Kyoto with the world, transcending traditional genres, venues, and boundaries.

KYOTOPHONIE Spring takes inspiration from its sister event's 2025 theme, HUMANITY, expanding the limits of photography into the sound and performance sphere.

Soundwalk Collective & Patti Smith: CORRESPONDENCES

The legendary poet returns to Japan for the first time in nine years!

During Golden Week on **Tuesday, April 29,** KYOTOPHONIE collaborates with MODE to bring **Patti Smith** and **Soundwalk Collective** to Kyoto for the premiere live performances of *CORRESPONDENCES* in Japan. Ticket sales for the matinee and evening performances begin on Saturday, February 15th, 2025 (10:00) on e+. *CORRESPONDENCES* is an ever-evolving project between Soundwalk Collective and Patti Smith that spans over ten years and traverses a wealth of geographies, histories, and natural environments.

The process sees Crasneanscki visit distant lands of poetic inspiration and historical significance, collecting sonic memories through field recordings. Smith then composes poems through an intimate dialogue with his recordings, whilst Soundwalk Collective edits visuals to match the soundtrack. This process of "correspondence" has resulted in the eight video works that form the core of the exhibition and performance. These works explore themes such as the Chernobyl nuclear disaster, forest fires and the mass extinction of animals, while also referencing artists and revolutionaries such as Andrei Tarkovsky, Jean-Luc Godard, Pier Paolo Pasolini, and Pyotr Kropotkin; questioning the relationship between man and nature, the role of the artist and the nature of humanity.

Previous formats of *CORRESPONDENCES* have included live performances, exhibitions, film screenings, poetry readings and workshops. These works have been presented around the world, including at the Venice Biennale and the Museum of Modern Art in Medellín, Colombia. In 2022, they also produced an exhibition titled *Evidence* at the Centre Pompidou in Paris.

In addition to the Kyoto performance, *CORRESPONDENCES* will be held in Tokyo as a performance on May 3 at the New National Theatre Opera Palace (Organised by MODE / YY Co., Ltd.), and in an exhibition, MOT Plus Soundwalk Collective & Patti Smith: *CORRESPONDENCES* at the Museum of Contemporary Art Tokyo from April 26 to June 29, 2025. Filipe Catto

Brazil's leading contemporary artist makes her Japan debut!



KYOTOPHONIE continues to introduce new sounds and forms of expression from around the world to Kyoto with the announcement of **Filipe Catto** to the 2025 Spring lineup. Catto, a leading figure in contemporary Brazilian music, will perform at **Hulic Hall Kyoto** on **Saturday, April 19**.

This marks Filipe Catto's Japan debut. Catto has quickly risen to fame in Brazil, earning recognition from icons such as Ney Matogrosso and Marina Lima. Her powerful voice and eclectic sound melds genres into a unique musical signature as can be heard on her album *Belezas são Coisas Acesas por Dentro* (2023), a reimagination of Gal Costa's music for a new generation. With vulnerability and depth, Catto interprets Gal's songs to reflect her experiences as a non-binary trans person living in São Paulo, Latin America's largest city.

Catto's KYOTOPHONIE performance will feature projections of images by legendary Brazilian photographer **Madalena Schwartz**, courtesy of Instituto Moreira Salles, Brazil. Schwartz was a figurehead in photographing the LGBTI+ community of São Paulo.

Former *Wednesday Campanella* founding vocalist, **KOM_I**, returns to Japan from Bahia, Brazil where she currently resides, to perform at **Hulic Hall Kyoto** on **April 19**.

KOM_I is renowned for exploring new expressive forms through the voice and body. Her expressions are known to challenge existing constructs. KOM_I's performance at KYOTOPHONIE will bring together new inspirations from the Amazon, Brazil, and beyond. Her previous works incorporate elements of Japanese folk performing arts, folklore studies, and North Indian classical music.

KOM_I's major works include the album *Yakushima Treasure*, created with Oorutaichi and inspired by Yakushima Island; the performance *A Dream Nesting in a Stone Chamber Tomb* at the Ishibutai Kofun in Asuka Village, Nara; and a solo performance of Christian Marclay's graphic score *No!* at the Museum of Contemporary Art Tokyo. New acoustic Salif Keita album 'So Kono' co-produced by KYOTOPHONIE and Nø Førmat!



The legendary Malian singer Salif Keita makes a grand return with *So Kono,* an acoustic and deeply intimate album, to be released on April 11, 2025.

Keita, dubbed "the golden voice of Africa," debuts in an intimate acoustic setting, returning to his roots with his long-time companion instrument, the guitar.

The idea of an acoustic album had long been dismissed by the artist however, during the 2023 KYOTOPHONIE Borderless Music Festival in Japan, organised by photographer Lucille Reyboz and encouraged by producer Laurent Bizot (Nø Førmat!), something changed. Surrounded by the spirituality of Komyō-in and supported by his loyal musicians – Badié Tounkara on ngoni and Mamadou Koné on percussion – Salif agreed to bare himself like never before.

Recorded in the intimacy of his hotel room in Kyoto, *So Kono* ("in the room" in Mandinka) captures the essence of Salif Keita: a powerful voice, shaped by trials and travels, elevated by minimalist arrangements. Blending reimagined classics and new compositions, this album resonates as a sincere and timeless work, reaffirming why Salif Keita is considered one of the greatest living singers, across all cultures and continents.

The album cover image was taken during Keita's stay in Kyoto by Lucille Reyboz, co-founder of the KYOTOGRAPHIE International Photography Festival & KYOTOPHONIE Borderless Music Festival. Reyboz is a long-time friend and photographer of the artist.

Patti Smith

Patti Smith, born in Chicago and raised in South Jersey, migrated to New York City in 1967. Her extensive achievements as a performer, author, recording and visual artist is acknowledged worldwide. Released in 1975, Smith's first recording, Horses, was inducted into the National Recording Registry at the Library of Congress in 2010 by the National Recording Preservation Board. Her subsequent albums include Radio Ethiopia, Easter, which included Because the Night, cowritten with Bruce Springsteen, Wave, Dream of Life, which included *People Have the Power* cowritten with her late husband Fred Sonic Smith, Gone Again, Peace and Noise, Gung Ho, Trampin', Land, Twelve, Banga, and Outside Society. She is a four-time Grammy® nominee and a Golden Globe nominee for the song Mercy Is cowritten with Lenny Kay for the film Noah. Steven Sebring's 2008 documentary, Patti Smith: Dream of Life, received an Emmy nomination. Patti Smith was awarded the prestigious 2010 National Book Award for her bestselling memoir, Just Kids, chronicling her deep friendship with photographer Robert Mapplethorpe and the evolution of their work. Her books include WiJ, Babel, Woolgathering, The Coral Sea, Auguries of Innocence, Collected Lyrics, M Train, Devotion, and Year of the Monkey.


Smith holds the honor of "Commandeur des Arts et des Lettres" from the French Ministry of Culture. In 2007 she was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. She was honored by ASCAP with the Founders Award in 2010, representing lifetime achievement, and was the recipient of Sweden's 2011 Polar Award, an international acknowledgement for significant achievements in music. In 2013, Smith received the Katharine Hepburn Medal from Bryn Mawr College, recognizing women whose contributions embody the drive and work ethic of the celebrated actress. In 2014, Barnard College Board of Trustees presented Patti Smith with their Medal of Distinction. In 2016, she was awarded the Burke Medal for Outstanding Contribution to the Arts in Trinity College, Dublin. Smith's photographs, drawings, and installations have been exhibited in galleries and museums worldwide. Coupled with her photography exhibit *Higher Learning*, Smith received the Laurea Magistrate causa from Parma, Italy, and an honorary doctorate in Euro-American Literature from Padova University. Her renowned band includes guitarist and author Lenny Kaye, who she has collaborated with since 1971, drummer Jay Dee Daugherty since 1975, Tony Shanahan on bass and keyboards, since 1996, and her son, guitarist Jackson Smith, for over a decade. At present Smith writes, performs, lending support for human-rights issues and environmental groups, primarily Pathway to Paris, a

nonprofit organization co-founded by her daughter, Jesse Paris Smith, offering tangible solutions for combating climate change. In May 2020, she received the PEN Literary Service Award, and an honorary Doctorate from Columbia University.

May 21, 2022, she received the French Legion of Honor for her life's work.



CORRESPONDENCES is an ongoing exhibition and performance between Soundwalk Collective and Patti Smith. Their collaboration began when Patti and Stephan accidentally met on a plane. Over the course of more than ten years, their creative partnership has grown, with live performances, exhibitions, screenings, poetry readings, and workshops presented around the world, from the Venice Biennale to the Museum of Modern Art in Medellín, Colombia. In 2022, they held an exhibition titled *Evidence* at the Centre Pompidou in Paris.


"Correspondences," the project being presented in Japan, marks their latest collaboration and is the product of a decade-long "dialogue" between Patti and Stephan. This ongoing and ever-evolving project evokes the "sonic memories" of various lands, embodying the footprints of artists, revolutionaries, and the ongoing impact of climate change.

Stephan visits lands with poetic inspiration or historical significance, collecting "sonic memories" through field recordings. Patti writes poetry in intimate dialogue with these recordings, and Soundwalk Collective edits visuals to accompany the soundtrack. These "correspondences" have resulted in the creation of eight video works that form the core of the exhibition/performance. These videos explore themes such as the Chernobyl nuclear disaster, forest fires, and mass extinction of animals. They also reference artists and revolutionaries like Andrei Tarkovsky, Jean-Luc Godard, Pier Paolo Pasolini, and Peter Kropotkin, posing questions to the viewer about the relationship between humans and nature, the role of the artist, and the essence of humanity.

KOM_I is an artist who primarily creates forms of expression through voice and body. She is influenced by Japanese folk performing arts, folklore studies, and North Indian classical music. She currently resides in Bahia, Brazil, and is working on a book about her childbirth experience in the Peruvian Amazon. Her major works include the album Yakushima Treasure, created with Oorutaichi and inspired by Yakushima Island; the performance A Dream Nesting in a Stone Chamber Tomb at the Ishibutai Kofun in Asuka Village, Nara; and a solo performance of Christian Marclay's graphic score No! at the Museum of Contemporary Art Tokyo. KOM I co-founded the artivism collective HYPE FREE WATER with visual artist Minori Murata to study and raise awareness about water-related issues. As an actress, KOM_I has appeared in NHK's Our Rainy Days, Netflix's Followers, and the film September 1923. KOM I was formerly the lead vocalist of the music group Wednesday Campanella, she left the group in 2021. She is currently based in Bahia, Brazil.

KYOTOPHONIE Borderless Music Festival, a biannual music event held in Kyoto, was established in 2023 by Lucille Reyboz and Yusuke Nakanishi (co-founders of KYOTOGRAPHIE International Photography Festival). Since its launch in 2023, KYOTOPHONIE events have reached approximately 37,000 people.

KYOTOPHONIE encourages creative experimentation that transcends traditional genres, venues, and formats. Each year KYOTOPHONIE introduces a diverse lineup of artists ranging from underground musicians to globally renowned performers, to audiences in Kyoto's most iconic venues.

During Spring, the festival is held alongside its sister event, the KYOTOGRAPHIE International Photography Festival. The KYOTOPHONIE program takes inspiration from its sister event's annual theme, expanding the limits of photography into the sound and performance sphere. In the Autumn, KYOTOPHONIE is a standalone event that delivers unprecedented musical experiences that evoke the feeling of traveling the world through sound.

[About MODE (Co-Organiser for Soundwalk Collective & Patti Smith: CORRESPONDENCES)]



MODE is a platform established in 2018 in London that introduces experimental music, audiovisual, and performing arts. Since its inaugural event curated by Ryuichi Sakamoto, it has developed into a space for international cultural exchange centered around "sound" in London and Tokyo. It organizes a diverse range of programs in locations with architectural features that respond to the space and the stories that these places hold, including urban voids and historical music venues. Through these programs, artists and audiences share music, art culture, and their historical backgrounds, sparking inspiration and creating a space for new experimental expressions.
